
State Agency Updates Submitted by Jo Dawson

SNA Legislative Focus Submitted by Dean Hamburg

I wanted share todays SNA PPL focus. Is an interesting time for SNA with Congress keeping re-authorization on the back-burner. Still, seems SNA is moving on some topics with proposals and letters and such.

SNA sent a letter to Appropriations with the equipment grant minimum purchase per site to be lowered from \$5,000.00 to \$1,000.00... My experience with this equipment grant sometimes included wishing it was lower than the \$5,000.00 purchase minimum per site. As small kitchens in Alaska sometimes did not need or have capacity for a \$5,000.00 equipment fix, it seemed a lesser minimum amount would have been more meaningful. Is my thought anyway.

Please take a look at the appropriations letter. Also-- please check out the SNA comment on the always challenging **Verification-Non Response** topic.

I do like how SNA brings up the concern about those households that may not respond due to language or literacy issues. Congress is currently touting changes in tax forms, to keep them simple for American taxpayers..... Seems to me the verification process is a hyper-complex non-simple task/process expected of school lunch programs and State Agencies and Households.

We want integrity and good records for NSLPs.... But sometimes seems local NSLP operators are required to be IRS like, when we just want to feed kids.
